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# Personality Profile

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Carroll P. Sheehan, Vice President of R. M. Bradley, was born in Boston and educated at Suffolk University, where he received a B.S. degree in Journalism and studied towards a Masters degree. Discharged from the Marine Corps in 1953, he worked for the Roger L. Stevens Development Corp. He has since been affiliated with the Farragut Cooperative Bank in So. Boston, serving as Pres. and Dir., the Real Property Board (60-62) as Assoc. Commissioner, the City Gov't Comm., Board of Zoning Adjustment, the Milton Board of Appeals, the GBREB, serving on the Legislative Affairs Committee, and the SIR. Working in Mass., Mr. Sheehan is credited with leasing and selling over 6,000,000 sq. ft. of mill space, his specialty, and leasing the Pequot Mills in Salem, Mass, which amounted to over one and a quarter million dollars. He is presently working for R. M. Bradley as Consultant for Norwell's Barque Hill 100-home sites development. As a member of the GBREB's Speakers Bureau, Mr. Sheehan warns suburban communities to help accept the responsibility, which has accrued to them, for the City of Boston, and put a halt to restraining measures against progress in the Boston area. Outlying communities are interdependent with Boston and must realize this fact. He also lauds the idea of metropolitan planning as a means of benefit for the Commonwealth of Mass., and urges real estate educational institutions to stress and extend commercial and industrial courses, since there is a definite lack of information on these subjects elsewhere. He also pointed out the fact that practising brokers deal mainly in the residential field, due to a lack of experience and knowledge in the comm. and ind. areas.
