That age-old golden rule philosophy of "do unto others, etc." has helped Stanley Fisher become one of New England's most respected industrial developers. The owner and developer of the 325 acre Farmington Industrial Park, Stanley has recently broken ground on park #2, 182 acres in Wallingford.

Between 1933 and 1942, Fisher actively practiced law in the Hartford area, handling mainly corporation work. Forming the Conn. Spring Corp. in 1938; a firm consisting of 1800 sq. ft. and 6 employees, Stanley sold it in 1964, consisting of 84,000 sq. ft. and 700 employees.

"The development began in 1960 when I purchased 108 acres in Farmington for Conn. Spring. I tried to build a plant perfect for the employees, noting that the happier an employee is, the more he produces. I have found over the years that if a worker can be given dignity he will react positively. I wanted our people to be proud to bring their family and friends on a tour of their place of business. It has worked with our company and today we have 16 other firms in Farmington using the same philosophy with 7 more planned. This record after only 3 years, proves that our philosophy is sound. For example we have 7 parts land to 1 part building. All the plants have soundproofing, cafeterias and air-conditioning. But, you have to see it to appreciate it --- and busloads do just that every week.

"My future will be spent helping to develop industrial parks, mine or otherwise. Employees act as they are treated and a well built plant can produce an efficient, proud employee."

Married with two children, Fisher is a former director of Rotary, an associate director of the Conn. Bank and Trust Co., and has been appointed by the Governor to the Board of Landscape Architects. Residing in West Hartford, his spare time is spent fishing and boating.
