Martha Werenfels, a principal architect at Durkee, Brown, Viveiros & Werenfels Architects of Providence, has been elected to the board of advisors of the National Trust for Historic Preservation. She will serve as advisor to the national nonprofit preservation organization for a three-year term. Werenfels has worked on a great variety of historic preservation projects, including the Rhode Island State House, the Newport Casino, and the Tabernacle on Martha's Vineyard. She is involved in several projects that focus on combining historic preservation and sustainability principles.

Werenfels serves as a board member of the Providence Preservation Society Revolving Fund and PAL Inc., a non-profit cultural resources firm. She holds a bachelor of architecture from Cornell University and a master's degree in American History from Brown University.
