To obtain a PMP credential, an individual must satisfy education (35 hours) and experience (no less than 4500 hours) requirements, agree to adhere to a professional code of conduct and pass the PMP examination.

Buchok has more than 30 years of experience in the HVAC and energy management industry. At EMCOR Energy Services he is responsible for managing projects involving the installation of building automation systems, and design and construction of large tonnage industrial cooling plants and cogeneration power plants. Buchok earned an associates degree in engineering technology from Northwestern Community Technical College and a bachelor's in corporate and organizational management from the University Of Connecticut. Certified as an energy manager by the Association of Energy Engineers, he also holds an unlimited heating-cooling contractor's S-1 license from the State of Connecticut. He is a member of the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) as well as the Project Management Institute. In 2008, he won an award from Pratt & Whitney for his contributions to the successful completion of a combined heat and power plant.
