

Elton shows how Branford's business friendly approach encourages new ventures and expansions

"Branford: n. 1. CT town. 2. vital, strong, low taxes." That is how the CT Economic Digest described Branford, going on to say the town has "a strong economic base, low taxes, and excellent schools and municipal services. The town is rather unique among the shoreline towns east of New Haven in that it has encouraged substantial development in well-defined districts."

Enjoying four exits on I-95 and only minutes from I-91, Branford is just ten miles east of New Haven, 45 miles south of Hartford and Bradley International Airport, an hour from Providence on I-95 and only two hours from the heart of New England - Boston, the town serves a dual role as a gateway to New England and a portal to New York.

Branford is an integral part of a regional economy [visit www.rexdevelopment.org] that hosts six major universities, an extensive rail system with Shore Line East, MetroNorth and Amtrak, convenient flights from Tweed New Haven Airport [www.flytweed.com] and international air service out of Bradley Airport.

Current infrastructure projects to support our business community include the recent expansion of the Branford train station to accommodate up to 500 vehicles; construction of a new 34,000 s/f fire house centrally located on Rte. 1 near I-95, bridge replacement and widening of School Ground Rd. to improve the Rte. 1 - Rte. 139 link on the east end of town, and the Amtrak bridge replacement over Rte. 1 at Exit 53 and Rtes. 142 and 146 on the west end of town, a major stimulus project that will result in improved traffic flow and will create commercial expansion opportunities.

With a healthy business climate and a diverse local economy that includes bioscience, manufacturing, healthcare, service industries, and retail ranging from unique boutiques to the leading national chains, Branford's major commercial residents include: 454 Life Sciences, an R&D powerhouse in biotech; CAS Medical, among the Connecticut Technology Council's "Top 40" fastest growing technology companies; Branford Hills Health Care Center, recipient of the American Health Care Association's "Step 1 Quality Award"; and Zane's Cycles, a national leader in retail and active lifestyles.

The past year Branford has seen a variety of new and expanding businesses: manufacturers Accurate Wire has started on a 20,000 s/f expansion and Cherry Hill Glass is moving forward with its expansion into the former Atlantic Wire site; CT Orthopaedics opened a new 18,000 s/f surgical facility with three operating rooms and new medical offices; biotech GigaCyte opened an R&D facility on Business Park Dr. while high tech manufacturer Pexagon moved in around the corner; and following major facelifts to retail giants Walmart and Kohl's, the neighboring Dress Barn plaza is about to do the same at its Rte. 1 location on Branford Hill.

These businesses recognize that Branford offers what every company seeks: full municipal services (water, sewer, etc.), a skilled workforce, one of the lowest tax rates along the I-95 corridor, and

convenient transit links. And the town's triple-A bond rating assures everyone that Branford is financially well-managed - quite an accomplishment in this economy.
