The New England Real Estate Journal's managing editor, Ben Summers recently was honored by receiving the Presidential Volunteer Service Award. It was recommended by the Talking Information Center where Ben has volunteered for 2,000 hours during the past more than 30 years.

He reads and records Bloomberg Business Week and the Economist every week. The recordings are broadcast to blind and handicapped residents throughout Massachusetts over a special FM frequency.

The award was created by the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation to encourage ongoing involvement in service and civic engagement. It was created by the first President George H.W. Bush and has been continued by all succeeding Presidents.
