From Mills to Micro-Lofts breakfast seminar at Traditional Building Conference on July 25

"From Mills to Micro-Lofts: Sustainable Design Solutions for Urban Living" subject of breakfast seminar at Traditional Building Conference July 25.

Adapting historic mills and other large structures is not a new story; adapting historic spaces for micro-sized living is a new story.
