Officially recognized by the U.S. Senate, World Plumbing Day, started by the World Plumbing Council, occurs on March 11th "every year...everywhere," and promotes the importance of global access to proper plumbing and sanitation.

Natural disasters such as the 2010 earthquake in Haiti or the subsequent tsunami in Japan were recent reminders of the importance of access to clean water and proper sanitation.
