Fitness equipment developing eco-friendly products

Ray Navarre of Aeromat Eco-Wise Products said "EcoWise was developed to offer the consumer a more healthy and environmentally friendly atmosphere. We use a closed cell foam material that is free of PVC, Phthalate, and Chlorides in our mats, foam rollers and medicine balls. Many commercial facilities, particularly hospitals and rehab locations are requiring latex free products; eventually this will be mandatory in settings such as schools and commercial gyms."

Since the fitness industry is focused on the health and well being of its participants, it is only fitting that eco-friendly products are being developed to protect the future of the environment.
