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The Abbey Group breaks ground on \$200 million The Viridian at 1282 Boylston Street project

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Developers The Abbey Group, along with mayor Thomas Menino, recently held a ceremonial groundbreaking for The Viridian at 1282 Boylston St., which will include 342 residences (including 38 affordable housing units), 295 underground parking spaces and 10,000 s/f of ground-level retail space. The \$200 million project is set to be completed in the spring of 2015.

In addition to housing and retail space, 1282 Boylston will provide the neighborhood with a Community Center large enough for multiple functions and events.
