Development services for Gallery and Perry are being handled by Stratton Development Management and Waypoint KLA, respectively, and construction and permanent financing for the project is provided by Cambridge Savings Bank. Brokerage services were delivered by The Conrad Group's Peter Cooney and James McEvoy, who represented Gallery, and Richard Beal of the Perry Brokerage Associates, who represented Perry.

"The location and design of the new facilities will permit Gallery to meet customers' needs even more effectively and efficiently in a growing South Shore market, while offering an expanded selection of vehicles, including the MINI brand," said A.W.
