Michael Sanders, the administrator of the Office of Transit and Ridesharing for the Connecticut Department of Transportation, gave a great presentation. Many of our members left with a whole new understanding of exactly what the project was and how it will affect their property if they are located along the route.

March 30 - April 1, brought the BOMA Middle Atlantic Conference of the Building Owners and Managers Association, otherwise know as "The Mac." This year the MAC was held in beautiful Boston at the Boston Marriott Long Wharf. A hearty congratulations goes out to BOMA Boston chapter president Rick Page and his group for putting on a fantastic conference. And the speakers were fascinating. Our breakfast keynote speaker was Roger Berkowitz, president and CEO of Legal Sea Foods.
