Forward Looking Sonar is an important tool for 21st Century by providing ship operators what is under the water in front of them - before they run aground as well as offering protection from underwater threats."

It's particularly fitting that FarSounder, which has been in operation since 2001, is located in the Ocean State, and I am proud to recognize a Warwick-based company for its success, innovation, and earning Rhode Island's first Tibbett Award.
