

Fish of Suffolk Const. chairs 10th anniversary Inner City 100 event

Suffolk Construction Co. CEO John Fish chaired the 2008 10th Anniversary Inner City 100 event, which included the ranking of the fastest-growing businesses in the nation's inner cities.
