Our low impact development design solutions included a green roof, permeable paver plaza with stormwater storage reservoir, green screen walls, the solar panel covered parking, bioswale to treat the first flush runoff, an eco-art fountain designed to purify the water using plants and not chemicals and rainwater harvesting system and cistern storage for irrigation.
