With several major hospitality initiatives already completed, including Proclamation Ale's new brewery and tasting facility across from the Interlink Train Station and completion of a \$3.7 million pedestrian enhancement within City Centre, along with the construction of the new \$23 million Hyatt Place Hotel, and additions to RI mall, including new restaurants and stores, the city continues moving, showing vibrant economic growth.

Green Airport remains a top rated airport and driving factor in growing our local economy.

It's exciting to continue to see positive changes occur at iconic Rocky Point, which continued to thrive as a destination for both visitors and residents alike this summer with lots of activity including the return of "Movies in the Park," food trucks and family friendly concerts. And in July, we unveiled 10 new signs that showcase Rocky Point's history. The installation of these signs adds an additional aesthetic benefit to the revitalization of the grounds and offers visitors a unique and interesting way to experience the history of the park.

This was definitely a benchmark year for our city. I'm confident 2018 will carry on our current momentum and Warwick will continue to be the best place in Rhode Island to live, work, play and stay!
