I'm happy to report that we have launched and begun to market the new Building Mass Careers website (www.buildingmasscareers.com), which highlights the many benefits of a career in construction. Next month, we will launch a pre-apprenticeship program at Malden High School, which will work to instill a strong work ethic and provide its participants with basic construction training, made possible with ABC's first-ever grant from the Commonwealth Corporation.

None of this progress would have been possible without the successful collaboration of ABC, our Merit Apprenticeship Program (MAP), and the Gould Construction Institute. Together we provide members with a wide range of education and training resources.

This good work is paying handsome dividends when it comes to building membership. This fall, another successful membership drive yielded 30 new members, and our chapter is enjoying its fifth consecutive year of membership growth.

Whether it's taking part in the membership drive, becoming a member of MAP, training at the Gould, or supporting our government affairs efforts, continuing to build on the momentum we have established ultimately depends on the support of ABC members. We will have excellent leadership in 2018 from John Anderson, who as chair of the Government Affairs Committee has been one of the main reasons for our growing impact on Beacon Hill.

Our chapter has much to build on in 2018, but we also face many challenges as we work to further market our brand, recruit new candidates and fund additional training initiatives. Achieving success in these areas is important to our companies and to the industry, and I know that both John and all of you are up to the task.
