Boston, MA 2018 marks an historic milestone for the family-owned Marr Companies as it celebrates its 120th year in business. (specialty shoring and rigging). Over the decades, Marr has left a long-lasting footprint on its neighborhood and the New England region contributing to the area's overall growth and development. Working with a wide range of customers – from subcontractors and general contractors to property owners and developers—the company has been fortunate in cultivating long-standing relationships, earning trust and continued business. Marr has welcomed the access it has been given to helping build the city's newest skyscrapers and restore and maintain its cherished, historic landmarks. The company takes pride in the work performed on the countless projects that have shaped its journey and a select few stand out in terms of scope and impact on the community. Some early projects included the Commonwealth Pier 5 (1914), later known as the World Trade Center, and Braves Field (1915) built for the Boston Braves baseball team, now serving as BU's Nickerson Field. Later projects included: The Museum of Science (1960s), The Boston Garden (1966), Schaefer Stadium (1970) and Rowes Wharf (1988). More recent highlights include Northeastern University (2015), Harvard's SEC (2017), and Wynn Boston Harbor (2018). Additionally, Marr has its hand in the building and ongoing restoration and maintenance of city landmarks and iconic institutions, including: Old North Church, Faneuil Hall, MA State House, Moakley United States Courthouse, John F. Kennedy Library and

Museum, Copley Place, Logan Airport and Mass. General Hospital.

In this anniversary year, the company has taken time to rummage through its archives and reflect on its extensive library of past projects. The Marr history is a rich one as the company has grown along with the city of Boston, which has come into its own as a world-class destination. Marr has been privileged to participate in ways both big and small in a wide range of building construction projects.
