However, with the mild temperatures that February brought to the Ocean State, it is easy to believe spring is right around the corner. As warm weather and a new season approach, it is exciting to think of all the spring pastimes that we will soon be able to enjoy.

One of the most iconic locations in Warwick, Rocky Point Park is sporting a new dock and picnic area. Our Department of Public Works crews, with help from the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management (DEM) have completed the new fishing pier for visitors to enjoy. Additionally, work has begun erecting a new covered picnic area where the Olympic-sized swimming pool once was. The project, which will be constructed by the New England Recreation Group, was approved by the City Council at the beginning of 2018. A similar makeover will also be happening at City Park, after a similar grant was awarded for \$350,000. Workers will be installing two more sheltered picnic areas, as well as eight dugout style shelters. More plans are in the works for Rocky Point, as city and DEM officials determine how to continue improvements with the grant funding.
