Making their home on Universal Blvd., the family owned and operated pizzeria boasts thin crust pies made from recipes that dates back to 1925. We are thrilled to welcome the Pepe's family to Warwick and look forward to sampling every one of their specialty pizzas.

And those traveling to Warwick now have another hotel to choose from. The newly reopened Fairfield Inn and Suites reopened last month.
