BOMA Engineering Committee hosts fire safety discussion Sept. 12

Boston, MA On September 12, the BOMA Boston Engineering Committee hosted a discussion with Lt. Paul Fitzpatrick with the Boston Fire Department on construction fire safety and prevention plans. A focus of the conversation was on the NFPA241 and the following items:

- What the Boston Construction Safety Unit is and what they do;
- Changes and requirements of the NFPA241;
- Project specific vs. building specific requirements; and
- Hot work standards and NFPA25.

An important discussion on Cyber Security, hosted by the BOMA Preparedness Committee, was held on October 2. Attendee take-aways included: How to protect yourself, your company, and your resources from cyber threats. James Whalen, senior vice president, chief information officer at Boston Properties, provided a primer on cyber security and commercial real estate.
