"Service with the Speed of Sound" has been the company's slogan since 1959, and

we're thrilled that all those who visit Warwick are now able to enjoy this old-fashioned themed eatery.

Also coming to the city is Tavolo Wine Bar & Tuscan Grille. Known for their classic Italian fare, the newest restaurant to call Warwick home is set to open its doors in the coming weeks. With a heavy focus on fresh, innovative and local ingredients those dining at Tavolo can enjoy one of the 70 beers on tap and the meticulously curated selection of wines that have been developed by the owners to complement each item on the menu. Located directly across the street from T.F. Green, travelers looking for a convenient yet delicious dining experience will be merely a crosswalk away.

As we head into the spring months, more exciting announcements will be coming down the pike. From welcoming new restaurants to establishing new and exciting activities for residents and visitors alike, Warwick continues to be on the move.
