Rich passed away suddenly on Monday, September 21, and they are heartbroken by the untimely passing of their beloved colleague. After a twenty-year career coaching college sports, Rich joined A.W. Perry in 2004. Since assuming the CEO position, he has been an inspirational mentor to a growing and enthusiastic A.W. Perry team focused on his vision of growing the company and practicing excellence in serving their tenants and clients.
