

Cambridge Polymer Group to move to Cummings Properties' TradeCenter 128

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Woburn, MA Cambridge Polymer Group is moving its operation from Charlestown to a 17,000 s/f space at Cummings Properties' TradeCenter 128 business campus. It is expected to occupy its custom-built new office and laboratory facility in August.
