I was so nervous about how I would perform at first, but now I love the challenge of handling various tasks at once and showing my teams I can reliably track and perform a range of tasks on schedule.

What tips or advice would you offer to other women who are considering entering the AEC industry? People are an excellent resource. I would encourage other women to talk to professors, professionals, trade members, and other knowledgeable persons within the AEC industry. These conversations allow women to hear firsthand what these persons love about their fields and will help women build awareness about the various ways their skills can be used and what fields may interest them. For me, hearing how a mentor's education and career path wasn't linear, but instead had humps and bumps and barriers, was important. Understanding I wasn't alone really allowed me to steel myself against challenges and pick myself up from my perceived failures.
