What was your greatest professional achievement or most notable project in the last 12 months?

One professional achievement that will always stand out for me is the SGA-designed AutoDesk BUILD Space. To accomplish this, my team beta tested BIM360 and digitally fabricated design elements for the office space to showcase the concepts and work done within. Being a part of the inaugural class of designers to implement BIM360 and in the context of delivering this one of a kind maker-space to support the broader A/E/C industry was certainly a 'once in a lifetime' project experience—a sentiment shared by SGA Founding Partner: Jeff Tompkins.

What has been the driving force behind your success in the AEC industry?
