

Walsh of A.P. Construction receives David N. LaBau Award by Construction Institute

Stamford, CT Tom Walsh, executive vice president of A.P. Construction Company, has received the Construction Institute's David N. LaBau Lifetime Recognition Award. He will be honored at the Institute's annual dinner and awards event on June 6, 2024.

The David N. LaBau Lifetime Recognition Award honors a lifetime of dedication to the Construction Institute and a continued impact on the Architecture, Engineering, and Construction (AEC) industry. The award is named after David LaBau, FAIA, a founding principal of the SLAM Collaborative. He chaired the AIA committee for the creation of the Graduate School of Architecture at the University of Hartford and was a founding member of the Construction Institute. Awarded only 14 times in the Institute's 49-year history, Walsh joins Laura Cruickshank of the University of Connecticut as this year's recipients.

"Tom's extensive experience has been instrumental in shaping A.P. Construction's success. His leadership and dedication are highly respected within our company and industry," said Andy Ashforth, CEO and president of A.P. Construction Company.
