Patrick Beaton

Patrick Beaton, regional property manager: Beaton started his career with Dolben in the summer of 2015 as a roving maintenance team member. He continued to seasonally rove in various capacities through college, and ultimately joined the 2020 manager in training (MIT) program. From there, he became the assistant property manager at The Q, in Quincy, MA and played a valuable role getting the property leased-up. His experience at The Q prepared him well for his next role, the assistant property manager at Breakwater/Cove164, in Lynn, MA. Both properties were in lease-up at the same time, and Beaton played an integral role in the success of the lease-up, both in terms of leasing and operations. In June 2022, Beaton was promoted to property manager at Halyard in Gloucester, MA. Throughout his tenure there, the property has performed extremely well. He has created a great rapport with residents and has been a solid example of high customer service to his team. Most recently, Beaton has led the team at Aster at the Summit, a lease-up property in Wakefield, MA. Brian Johnston

Brian Johnston: Regional Property Manager: Johnston became property manager of Park Station Apartments in Gaithersburg, MD in 2021. In this role he managed capital projects, garage repairs and unit renovations, providing stability to the onsite management team.
