I worked on a bid proposal for the National Mall Turf Restoration and Irrigation project in Washington, D.C. and personally delivered it to the National Park Service's Denver Service Center. After the project was awarded, I worked on site, overseeing the installation of one of four underground cisterns. Together, these cisterns collect up to one million gallons of rainwater for turf irrigation. With the National Mall hosting more than 30 million visitors every year, I am proud to have contributed to this hidden gem of sustainability.
