Warwick maintains a healthy mix of manufacturers and a diverse commercial base, and we're a popular destination for those looking to join our myriad of national, regional, and local retailers. There is also a thriving small business community and a particularly strong hospitality and tourism industry.

The award-winning City Centre Warwick – an intermodal, 24/7, "live/work/play" development concept – continues to gain momentum, bringing revitalization and new, mixed-use development to more than 100 acres surrounding the airport and the InterLink. New single-family residences have been constructed, and there are a number of major projects presently in various stages of the development and construction processes.

The Presley, a complex featuring studio and one-bedroom apartments with premium amenities at affordable monthly rates, has begun leasing. Its many features include an outdoor deck and BBQ area, fitness/wellness center, an indoor pool, clubhouse, and on-site restaurant and retail. Likewise, the Alta Altitude complex is now accepting resident applications for their one-, two- and three-bed apartments. Like The Presley, Alta is pet-friendly. Their amenities include a fitness center, resort-style pool, resident lounges, gaming and entertainment spaces, a courtyard with grilling stations, fire pits, work-from-home pods, and a pet spa and park. Both projects are seeing tremendous interest in folks looking to live here in Warwick.

Additionally, the city enjoys a well-established partnership with the Central Rhode Island Chamber of Commerce, and welcomes working with companies looking to move here in order to capitalize on Warwick's affordability and central location. Here, employers can find a highly-educated, skilled labor pool within a 50-mile radius to meet the needs of high-tech, biotech, defense and manufacturing industries in a tax-friendly environment.
