## City of Manchester Mayor's Letter

Dear New England Real Estate Journal readers,

The Elliot at River's Edge project, the largest development in Manchester in more than 30 years, is a state-of-the-art health care, retail and residential project. One of the first developments will be the state's first Job Corps campus. When completed in 2010, regional youth will have the opportunity to learn skills to excel in a demanding and more technical world.
