Stephen Amoroso, AIA, Stephanie Paolino, AIA, and Andrew Hausmann, of Vision 3 Architects have scompleted the U.S. Green Building Council's certification requirements to become LEED Accredited Professionals. Their achievement brings the number of LEED Accredited Professionals on Vision 3's staff to nine.

Amoroso, a licensed architect, graduated from Roger Williams University with a Bachelor of Architecture degree in 1996. He joined Vision 3 in 1997 as an intern architect. He served as project manager on the University of Rhode Island Hope Commons Dining Hall project.
