

KBE Bldg. Corp. selects projects for 50 Ways to Make a Difference

One of the projects selected is the \$1500 sponsorship of a mentor for Covenant to Care for Children, based in Bloomfield. Covenant to Care for Children is a nonprofit, private agency working with faith communities to meet the needs of abused, neglected, and impoverished children and teens.
