The Center for Life Science at 3 Blackfan Circle has been awarded LEED Gold certification, one of the highest certifications awarded by the U.S. Green Building Council. William A. LEED certification provides an independent, third-party verification that a building project is environmentally responsible, profitable and a healthy place to live or work.

With 18 stories above ground, the Center is the tallest building in the Longwood Area. The Center is owned by BioMed Realty Trust.
