Westwood Station developers Cabot, Cabot & Forbes (CC&F), Commonfund Realty and New England Development in partnership with the New England Revolution, hosted a free soccer clinic for Westwood, Norwood and Canton youth soccer players.

Defenseman Jay Heaps, goal keeper Matt Reis, Bryan Byrne, Brad Knighton, Willie Sims and Miguel Gonzalez represented the Eastern Conference Division team at the clinic. The clinic was held at the Westwood Station Athletic Field on the site of the proposed Westwood Station, a 4.5 million s/f mixed-use development located at Rte. 128 and I-95.

The clinic kicked-off with skill sessions on dribbling and passing as well as organized scrimmages. The New England Revolution Academy staff, with help from soccer affiliated community members, directed elementary and middle school soccer players through the activities. The pro-players offered group and individual instruction for clinic participants as well as signing autographs and posing for pictures with all attendees. In addition to the free clinic, attendees had the chance to win a team-autographed jersey and soccer ball as well as 2008 season tickets.
